

IAM Mature Drivers Review Course overview

Drivers will receive a written account of the session, which is a completely personal report, shared with no one else.

Our examiners will give you their honest opinion. We do not asses your fitness to drive. This is a matter for your GP and the DVLA.

Red 1

You will be given advice about your driving performance and a written report at the end of your assessment.

To book: email drivers@red1ltd.com or call 01392 444773. The assessment will usually take place from your home address and in your own vehicle so that you feel more comfortable and will cost £55.

You must notify the Driver and Vehicle Licensing Agency (DVLA) of certain medical conditions which may affect your ability to drive safely. Information regarding conditions can be found at

www.gov.uk/driving-medical-conditions or by writing to Drivers Medical Enquiries at DVLA, Swansea, SA99 1TU Telephone 0300 790 6806 Cornwall mobility, is an independent charity and one of 17 DVLAaccredited Driving Mobility Centres. Based in Truro, the team visit Liskeard, Plymouth, Exeter, Penzance, Launceston and Holsworthy. they aim to enable individuals to start, continue or return to driving to maintain an independent lifestyle.

They are supported by a fully qualified Occupational Therapist and can offer advice, information, assessment and training in the use of adapted or modified driving controls and seating.

Fitness to drive assessments last approximately two hours and include a pre-drive consultation and an on-road drive in one of the centre's modern, dual-controlled vehicles. At the end of the on-road drive, verbal recommendations will be given and these will be followed by a comprehensive written report. This is recognised by the DVLA and may assist in licence re-application or where any medical investigations are being carried out.
